JOINT ADMISSIONS AGREEMENT BETWEEN SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND FIVE TOWNS COLLEGE

A. Purpose of Agreement

1. To outline procedures to jointly admit students from Suffolk County Community College (SCCC) and Five Towns College (FTC) to begin studies at FTC after completion of one of the approved SCCC associate's degrees.
2. To facilitate the transfer process, and to provide students with appropriate choices through course matching and placement to maximize the number of transferable credits.
3. To increase enrollment of SCCC graduates at FTC who plan to pursue specified baccalaureate degrees entering Five Towns College with associate degrees in:

Theatre: Drama Option A.S. Degree

Music: Music Option A.S. Degree

Radio and Television Production: A.A.S. Degree

Liberal Arts & Science: Education (Child Study) A.A. Degree

B. Terms of Agreement

1. Qualified students who are accepted into one of the approved programs at SCCC will be simultaneously accepted to FTC through the Joint Admissions Program. Students must either be transfer applicants with less than 60 credits of completed college work, or currently matriculated SCCC students who apply to the Joint Admissions Program prior to the completion of 60 credits at SCCC.
2. Students may continue their education at Five Towns College following the completion of the associate's degree.

3. Scholarships:

- a. Transfer Scholarships: All SCCC students in the Joint Admissions Program with an Associate degree will be offered transfer scholarship to FTC of \$1,500 per year, in addition to other scholarships which may be eligible.
- b. Merit Scholarships: Students who have attained a G.P.A. at SCCC of 3.0-3.1 will receive \$1,500 per year; students who have a G.P.A. of 3.2-3.5 will receive \$2,000 per year; students who have a G.P.A. of 3.6-4.0 will receive \$3,000 per year.
- c. Talent Scholarships: Students in Music and Theatre must audition for their scholarship which may range from \$1,500 per year to a full scholarship.

It is possible for a student to receive a combination of scholarships. In all cases transfer students are required to file for financial aid.

4. The application process will be simplified for Joint Admissions candidates. SCCC transcripts will be sent to FTC twice, once in the student's last semester at SCCC, and again, when the final semester and graduation date is posted to the transcript.
5. SCCC will provide a list of all Joint Admissions candidates in order for FTC to set up a Joint Admissions Transfer Session for those interested students. Included in these sessions will be representatives from Five Towns College. These meetings will take place as needed and determined by SCCC contacting the FTC admissions office.
6. As long as students have followed the curriculum as outlined in the 2006-2008 SCCC catalog for one of the approved associate's degrees, it will be possible for the student to complete the baccalaureate degree in four additional semesters (or the equivalent for part-time students). All transfer credits will be accepted with a grade of "C" or better.
7. Students selected for the Joint Admissions Program must complete the admissions process to Five Towns College upon or before graduation from Suffolk County Community College.

8. Both FTC and SCCC will designate coordinators of the Joint Admission Program who will work together to identify and follow up with Joint Admissions candidates.


C. Term of this agreement



**CHILDHOOD ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
FIVE TOWNS COLLEGE & SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

This program is articulated with Five Towns College and prepares students for careers in elementary education. Students will complete the A.A. degree at Suffolk County Community College and then transfer to Five Towns College for the baccalaureate degree.

The Education (Child Study) emphasis at Suffolk will offer a strong liberal arts foundation, while including courses specifically related to pedagogy. New York State teacher certification standards will be met through upper-level coursework at Five Towns College, including supervised student teaching. Successful completion of the full program will qualify students for provisional certification in elementary education (grades 1 through grades 6).

Admission Procedures and Requirements

Admission to the A.A. Liberal Arts and Sciences: Education (Child Study) Emphasis for entering students requires a Regent's Diploma and a minimum high school average of 80. Continuing students who wish to be admitted to the program must have completed EG11: Standard Freshman Composition, a mathematics or laboratory science course, and PC11: Introduction to Psychology with a GPA of 3.0 or better.

Graduates of the A.A. program at Suffolk will be required to have a 2.75 GPA to matriculate in the Childhood Education Program at Five Towns College.

Childhood Education Program at Five Towns College

The Childhood Education Program leads to the Bachelor of Science Degree. (B.S.) This program fulfills the New York State Education Department requirements for the Initial Certificate in Childhood Education 1-6.

There is a student teaching experience in both the upper (grades 4 – 6) and lower grade levels (grades 1 – 3) in a cooperating public school district under the supervision of the Chair of Childhood Education.

The courses in the Pedagogical Core designed for this program incorporate the new learning standards for students embodied in the regulations of the Commissioner of Education. This is a field experience based program with ample opportunity for observation and practical applications required in courses at both the lower (1 – 3) and upper (4 – 6) elementary grades and require 37 credits in this area.

The 30 credits in Content Core in Literature includes both intermediate and advanced level courses in the discipline. Literature has been selected for a major concentration in order to prepare graduates with a broad, humanistic appreciation of the world, its diversity, peoples and cultures.

The 47 credits in Liberal Arts courses in the General Education Core have been selected to broaden and elevate student awareness, cultivate the intellect and stimulate the imagination. These courses are designed to develop skills that will provide excellent preparation for a teaching career. Liberal arts courses that draw students into important new academic and intellectual areas and increase awareness of differing cultural heritages are a major component of the program.
